Congratulations are in order for our group 8 students, who have officially completed their Anglia English Examinations. This internationally recognized assessment is a significant step in their academic journey, providing them with a formal certified diploma that validates their English language proficiency.

The examination was comprehensive, testing the students across four core linguistic competencies: reading, writing, listening and speaking.

By tackling all four sections, students have demonstrated a well-rounded command of the language. This diploma isn't just a piece of paper; it's a global benchmark that sets a strong foundation for their transition to secondary education and beyond.



Well done to all the students for their hard work and dedication in preparing for this milestone!

Reading aloud - books in other languages

Twice a year, we organise Mother Tongue Reading Days at school. We do this because a strong foundation in the home language (the mother tongue) is essential for a child's language development. Research shows that children who have a good command of their home language learn a second or third language - such as Dutch or English - more easily and quickly.

Reading aloud in one's own language not only strengthens vocabulary, but also the emotional bond and the joy of reading. Fortunately, there is now a very wide range of multilingual books available online. In this context, we would like to draw your attention to [Lale Boekenhuis](#), an initiative by parents at our school. They focus specifically on books in languages such as Persian, Turkish and Kurdish, which closely reflect the children's lived experiences.

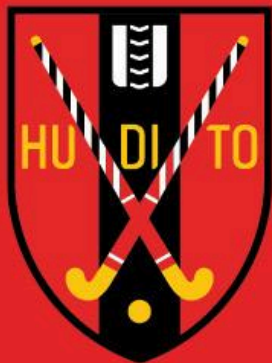
