### **Leave of absence**

Sometimes we get questions or confusion about leave.

The following information gives you more clarity. This can also be found in our school guide.

Except in case of illness, it is not permitted to miss school hours. Extra leave for holidays is not allowed. Children have 13 weeks of holidays. You have enough time to celebrate holidays together. There is only one exception, namely when one of the parents cannot be away during any of the school holidays. An employer's statement must then be submitted. The management is obliged to follow these rules and in case of violation to report this to the school official.



You can request a day off for a child in case of important circumstances, such as moving house, religious holidays, a marriage of a family member or an anniversary. The form 'request for exemption from school attendance' can be downloaded from the website:

A request form must be submitted to the integral school leader at least one month before the desired leave. You will receive an answer to your request within fourteen days.

Extra leave in the first two weeks after the school holiday is never allowed. Unauthorised absence must be reported to the school attendance officer.

#### **Parents wanted for the MR**

Melchior van der Veen and Derk van Veen have been in the MR for three years now and their term will end this summer. There will be elections again to choose new candidates for the next term of three years. Two positions for MR members are open. If there are only two candidates there will be no elections, but the candidates are directly elected.



The MR - Participation Council - consisting of staff members and parents/guardians think along, decide along and monitor developments at school. As MR member you are a critical discussion partner of the management. This role is legally defined, the management may not implement major changes without the consent of the MR. But also smaller topics are discussed, such as the latest developments regarding formation (staff shortage), the school guide, is the information on the website complete, etc. It is also important that concerns and questions from parents / caretakers are put on the agenda and discussed with staff and management. Meetings take place once every 6 weeks, this school year on the Tuesday evening from 19.30 to 21.30.
