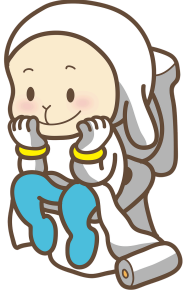

Potty training: practising together with pride and patience

Around the age of 18 months, many children begin to show interest in what happens on the potty or toilet. This is a good time to gently start potty training. Becoming potty trained is an important step in the development of independence and requires time, patience and positive attention. When practising, we look for signs that a child is ready, such as:

- Showing interest in the potty or toilet;
- Keeping nappies dry for longer;
- Pointing out or saying that the nappy is dirty;
- Wanting to help with changing or going to the toilet.

At the nursery, we follow what is being practised at home. We offer children the opportunity to use the potty at set times and praise every success, no matter how small. It is important that practising never becomes an obligation or a means of pressure, every child develops at their own pace. A fun and accessible way to introduce potty training is to read stories about using the potty or toilet. There are many cheerful picture books on this subject, which help children recognise what is happening and make the subject discussable in a positive way. Together with parents, we ensure that practising is positive, relaxed and consistent. This way, potty training becomes a step that a child can be proud of!

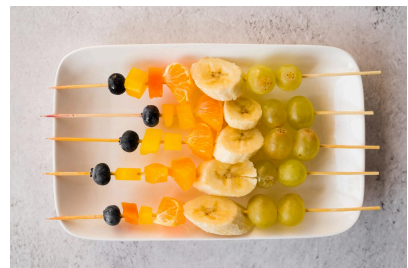
Healthy treats at the nursery

Hurrah, it's someone's birthday! Of course, we love to celebrate birthdays together with a cheerful treat. At our IKC, we believe it is important to strike a good balance between celebration and health. That is why we encourage healthy treats: something small, tasty and responsible. Think fruit skewers, raisins, snack vegetables or a small gift such as a balloon or sticker.

At the nursery (KDV) and after-school care (BSO), treats are sometimes eaten together with the children, in consultation with the pedagogical staff.

At the toddler care centre, the children always take their treats home with them. This allows parents to choose when and how their child eats it at home and the party can continue for a little longer!

Together, we ensure that treats remain a fun, healthy and enjoyable moment for everyone. Thank you for your contribution to a cheerful and responsible party!

If you would like to experience the arrival in person with your child, you can do so on Saturday 22

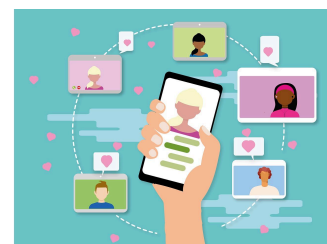

Treats

It's always a party when a child has a birthday and brings treats to school. The kindergartners get a birthday hat, everyone sings birthday songs and the children may choose a birthday card. Please consider bringing a healthy treat (see Pinterest) or a small gift. Bags full of candy or gifts are really not necessary.

Arriving on time

We are already 10 weeks into the school year. Fortunately, many children arrive at school on time every day. Unfortunately, we also see that some children are occasionally or even regularly late. This is not pleasant for the children themselves, as it prevents them from starting the day calmly and makes them feel uncomfortable when they enter a full classroom that has already started. It also disrupts the peace and quiet and the learning process for the other children in the group. We are obliged to register late arrivals.



If a child is late four times, we will have to discuss this with you. If a child is late eight times, you will be invited to a meeting at school with the teacher and/or head teacher. If a child is late 12 times, we will have to report this to the truancy officer. We naturally hope that it will not come to that. If you encounter any problems or need help or advice, please speak to the teacher, management or internal counsellor. This way, we can hopefully work together to ensure that all children arrive at school on time every day and start the day calmly together with the class.
